



 The two nations have much in common but some very special symbols and associations.

Scottish – the bagpipes are the national instrument and used often in Scottish celebrations such as weddings and parades



Irish – the world's oldest models of the harp date from I4th/I5th century Ireland. A traditional symbol of Ireland and found on the Irish punt and now Irish euro coins.











Irish – Ireland is famous for its dark ales. Note the Irish harp on the Guinness logo




Scottish – whisky from the Scottish Gaelic "uisge-beatha" (the water of life). Also known as "Scotch". Note the original Scottish form is "whisky". "Whiskey" is the term for non-Scottish whisky.













Scottish – the thistle is the national flower and emblem of Scotland. Found on Scottish coins and national insignia












Scottish – the kilt and highland dress are traditional Scottish clothes used for special occasions. Tartan (crosscheck) pattterns were developed in Scotland and were used to signify clan membership

Irish – the leprechaun is a mischevious elf from Irish mythology and his style of hat is often worn on St Patrick's Day









Irish – Irish stew made from beef or lamb is a famous national dish often served with another Irish staple - the potato



Scottish – haggis, the Scottish national dish, is made from lamb offal and oats and then boiled in a sheep's stomach. Eaten regularly, especially on Hogmanay (Jan 31st) and Burns Night (Jan 25th)
